The Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health proudly serves Vets through the Veteran Peer Access Network (VPAN) program. In addition to clinical services, LACDMH and our partners play a critical role in connecting veterans and their families with many other services and supports. Los Angeles County is home to the highest number of military veterans in the country. It is a DMH priority to advocate for Veterans across the region--wherever that advocacy is needed. VPAN is staffed by veterans and military family members who provide peer support and linkage to services to their fellow veterans and their family members. Callers are connected with housing, health care, financial, legal and employment advice & assistance resources, and clinical professionals are also available to assist those struggling with substance abuse and mental health issues.
