STANDING ORDER

Pursuant to Senate Bill 823, the State of California established the Office of Youth and Community Restoration (OYCR) within the California Health and Human Services Agency. As part of its mission, an Ombudsperson within OYCR is tasked with investigating complaints from youth, which may include issues relating to "harmful conditions or practices [in juvenile facilities], violations of laws and regulations governing facilities, and circumstances presenting an emergency situation." (Welf. & Inst. Code, § 2200, subds. (d)(1), (d)(2).)

In conducting such an investigation, the Ombudsperson may communicate directly with the youth so long as it provides at least forty-eight hours advance notice to the agency in direct control of the facility where the youth is housed. (Welf. & Inst. Code, § 2200(d)(5).) A request by the Ombudsperson to interview, photograph, videotape, or voice record a youth is governed by Los

Angeles Superior Court Local Rule 7.3(c), which states that a "member of the public...must obtain a court order from the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court prior to contacting a child if (1) the person seeks to interview, photograph, videotape, or voice record a child, who that person knows, or has reason to know, is under juvenile court jurisdiction and has been removed from the physical custody of the parent or legal guardian and (2) confidential information regarding the child's case or dependency or wardship status may or will be disclosed as a result." The Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court may grant the request on an ex parte basis upon a showing of good cause. (Super. Ct. L.A. County, Local Rules, rule 7.3(c)(4).)

Accordingly, upon consideration of the OYCR Ombudsperson's Request for Interviewing, Photographing, Videotaping, or Voice Recording of Juvenile Justice Children submitted on May 30, 2023, the Court finds good cause to authorize the Ombudsperson, or that person's designee, to interview, photograph, videotape, or voice record any youth detained by the Probation Department as part of its investigation into juvenile facilities. The Ombudsperson is ordered to maintain confidentiality as required by law. (Welf. & Inst. Code, § 2200.2, subds. (e)(1), (2).)
