

HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF HEARINGS WITHOUT A VERBATIM RECORD




The above chart illustrates the number of hearings that were held in family law, probate and unlimited civil courtrooms in quarter increments from January 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024. The number of hearings is broken down into hearings that were reported by a court-employed certified shorthand reporter and hearings that were not reported at all.


Please note that due to a worsening shortage of court reporters, the Superior Court of Los Angeles County (Court) does not normally provide official court reporters in family law and probate cases. To the extent available, the Court provides official court reporters in certain family law courtrooms (those dedicated to restraining order and domestic violence matters) and one day a week in other family law courtrooms (except for dedicated trial courts) and probate courts. 






NET LOSS OF COURT REPORTERS
