<p>Court Order for Post-Judgment Requests for Orders</p>	

This form must be completed only if you have a judgment in your case on all issues.

The Court orders that:

- ✓ The moving party must serve the other party with (1) a copy of this order and (2) a blank Post-Judgment Request for Order (RFO) Case Management Statement (LASC FAM 119) with the RFO.
- ✓ Each party must file and serve a Post-Judgment RFO Case Management Statement, form LASC FAM 119, at least **seven calendar days** before the date set for the RFO hearing.

The parties or counsel must discuss (in person or by telephone) at least **ten calendar days** before the RFO hearing the topics identified below. **[Note: Self-represented parties are not required to have this discussion if there is a current restraining order in effect involving the parties.]**

- What each party is asking for in this RFO and the reasons why.
- Suggestions on how to solve any dispute.
- Issues and facts that parties agree on and those they do not agree on. (Parties shall bring a list of such agreements or a signed stipulation to the hearing.)
- Whether a party wants the Court (1) to hear party or witness testimony at the RFO hearing **or** (2) to decide the RFO on the court papers only. If witnesses will testify, then discuss the witnesses' availabilities for the date of the scheduled hearing and for the next 120 days thereafter.
- Exchanging financial or other key documents before the RFO hearing.
- Whether a party intends to serve formal discovery (obtain additional information) before the RFO hearing.
- Whether any third person needs to be included in the RFO proceeding.
- ✓ The parties or counsel must appear on the date now scheduled for the RFO hearing. The Court may proceed on the hearing day or may schedule a future hearing date.
